
HONOREE, GEORGE MEYERS

During the Retiree Luncheon, Business Manager Jim Coyne recognized George Meyers, a 70 year member. George was born in 1918 and at the age of 98 is still telling stories of his experiences in World War II, as well as working as a union plumber in Chicago. He said, "I enlisted in the Navy three (3) days after the bombing of Pearl Harbor and I was put in a new division called the Seabees. George was in the 1st Battalion and their mission was to clear the land and build air fields in the South Pacific Islands. It was during these years that he welded steel pipe floating on empty 55 gallon drums that brought fuel from ships to shore.

After the war George became a proud Local 130 Union member. He said, "I told the men working with me to stand back and get a better look at the job before doing anything." The Seabees motto is "Can Do!" and George Meyers believed in this motto, especially on the job. As a new plumber, he worked on new and old homes, in the

downtown area, and finally spent his last 20 years at the University of Illinois. Some good advice that was given to him and that he passed on many times over the years to younger plumbers, "Don't stutter and don't hiccup if someone offers you work - just say yes - you can do it!" One thing for sure, his son Skip Meyers stated, "My father is not a big fan of plastic pipe."

On October 30, 2016 the Chicago Blackhawks honored George Meyers as a World War II veteran during the National Anthem at their game. This was an incredible tribute that will never be forgotten. It also showed appreciation to the World War II generation and to all service men and women both here and abroad.

Boy Scouts welcomed to Volo's JAC Training Center

On Saturday, December 3rd approximately 40 boy scouts, their troop leaders and a handful of parents came to the Local 130 JAC Training Center in Volo, IL to participate in the Plumbing Merit Badge Program hosted by Plumbers Local 130. The event, coordinated by Instructor in Charge Tom Jennrich, has been very successful with the scouting community. Hundreds of scouts have gone through training over the past five years with many compliments from the scouts, their parents and leaders saying, "This is the best merit badge they've ever attended."

The scouts rotated through working stations that demonstrated and allowed hands on tool use with material identification. The scouts also drew common plumbing systems and practiced at a service station. **Under strict supervision**, scouts did pipe joining using soldered copper tubing and fittings, threaded steel pipes, and solvent welded PVC fittings and pipe.

Instructor Phil Roknich stated, "For me the most exciting part was watching our apprentices train these young scouts. Our students become the teachers and share the many things they have learned in the apprenticeship program."

I appreciate the time and effort taken by the Instructors and these nine volunteers who gave up their Saturday.

MWRD - Sloan Valve Co. & Local 130 Water Conservation - Pilot Program

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) Board of Commissioners announced a water conservation pilot program at the MWRD's main headquarters at 100 E. Erie Street that could save 585,000 gallons of water annually. Sloan Valve Company, a manufacturer specializing in plumbing valves and fixtures, has donated 15 hybrid urinals for use in MWRD's main office. "This technology not only benefits the environment but also the taxpayers of Cook County," said President Mariyana Spyropoulos.

Business Manager Jim Coyne, who attended the press conference stated, "The 15 hybrid urinals will be installed this January

by MWRD Local 130 plumbers, making the MWRD the first unit of local government in Cook County to utilize the technology. Local 130 has been at the forefront of water and gray water conservation issues, and we're proud to support this pilot program."


